Code Adverse effects, the nature of the adverse effect such as:

Blood disorders (D56 - D76)
Contact dermatitis (L23 - L25)
Dermatitis due to substances taken internally (L27. -)
Nephropathy (N14.0 - N14.2)

ICD-10 Made Simple - DOCUMENT!

Acuity Acute, chronic, intermittent

Severity Mild, moderate, severe

Etiology Trauma, diabetes, renal failure, exercise or infection induced

Location Where is it- be specific about which joint, chest, femur, posterior thorax

Laterality Which side is it? Left, right, both

Detail Present on admission status, associated symptom (hypoxia, loss of consciousness), additional medical diagnoses, initial versus subsequent encounter
