NEWBORN, RESPIRATORY CONDITIONS

The following are important documentation tips and strategies for this disease/condition as required by the specificity needed in ICD-10:

- Identify respiratory conditions of a newborn, such as:
 - Neonatal aspiration of meconium, amniotic fluid, mucus, and blood occurring in utero and during delivery, which affects the health of the infant.
 - Aspiration of milk and regurgitated food and other substances.
- Indicate if Respiratory Distress Syndrome of the newborn
 - is Type I or Type II
 - differentiate between respiratory distress, respiratory failure, and respiratory arrest.
- Detail apnea as being primary obstructive sleep apnea,
 Apnea due to prematurity, or cyanotic attacks.
