## NON-INFLAM MATORY DISEASES OF FEMALE PELVIC ORGANS

The following are important documentation tips and strategies for this disease/condition as required by the specificity needed in ICD-10:

- State the location of endometriosis (e.g., ovary, fallopian tube, cutaneous scar, etc.).
- List the origin of female infertility (e.g., tubal, uterine, etc.).
  - Specify the type of infertility procedures (e.g., in vitro, embryo transfer, etc.).
- Provide information regarding the dysplasia level (i.e., mild (CIN I), moderate (CIN II), or severe (CIN III)).
- State the location of a fistula tract (e.g., vesicovaginal, vagina to small or large intestine, intestinal-genital tract, genital tract to skin, etc.).
- Identify the following:
  - Any intraoperative or postoperative complications or disorders affecting the genitourinary system (e.g., hemorrhage laceration, etc.).
  - Complications associated with artificial insemination (e.g., infection, hyperstimulation of ovaries, etc.).
- Detail the following:
  - Infectious agent.
  - Underlying disease or condition.
  - Psychogenic factors.
  - Congenital or malposition of pelvic organs.
