Major changes in ICD-10 include:

- Increased Specificity
- Axis of classification
- Laterality
- Specificity of Trimester for Obstetrical Coding
- Drug and Alcohol Code Expansion
- Complication and Combination Codes
- 7-digit Extension Codes

The upgraded system allows patient care and treatment to remain the same but properly reflects the advancement of the industry and allows for expansion with future advances.
